

Dear Friends,

If I asked you, "What is Advent?", you would probably say, "getting ready for Christmas." And so would I. If we haven't already, soon we will begin our preparations. We will send cards, put up evergreens and lights, erect a tree inside and festoon it with decorations, buy gifts, go to parties, bake cookies, plan festive meals, sing Christmas songs; we will get ourselves "in the mood" for Christmas.

This "mood" can certainly be lovely. It can be warm and nostalgic and a journey back to childhood, for some of us. (It can also heighten pain and loneliness for others of us.) Yet Advent, and Christmas as well, are much more than our mood, much more than we bargain for. And how will we get ready for that?

May I suggest: this year, listen to the Advent (which actually means "arrival" or "to come") lessons - the ones we hear in worship. They speak of judgment and of freedom; of God tearing open the heavens and coming down with anger; of the "Son of Man" coming with great power; and of God bringing comfort and freedom and healing to the people. Advent is not just Jesus coming as a pretty little baby; we also look ahead to Jesus coming again in glory.

This Advent may be a time of mixed feelings: memories and expectations, grief over someone not at the table this year, uncertainty about the state of the world. Soon a cold, dark world that knows too much death and sadness will be addressed by God's visit to Bethlehem. Just as we yearn for the lengthening days and the sun of spring, we are blessed with the Son of God.

The true promise of Advent is that God will be with us in January, and February, and in whatever the new year brings. The wonder of Advent is that God has come to dwell with us, to lead us through the darkness to the light, through sorrow to celebration. So don't be afraid of the tensions of this season. Trust the good and enduring God whose promise is deep and wide. God comes and dwells right in the middle of our frailties and failings and tensions....and hopes!

May our Advent prayer this year be not that we get all the preparations "right", but that God will fill our hearts with the hope that comes to us, born anew, at Christmas - the hope that enables us to live. What a good mood to be in!

Heart River Child Concert If you've been to an LCC worship service in the past few weeks, you've heard some of the Temple Talks about looking forward to a new paradigm of holistic stewardship in 2018 (Embracing Stewardship). The four fundamental principles of stewardship that were talked about are:

Everything we have or ever will have belongs to God. We are merely stewards of what belongs to God.

Stewardship is NOT about fundraising! Stewardship is about our growth and our development as disciples of Jesus Christ!

- **Proportional Giving**! What matters most is what the gift represents in terms of the giver's total income...not the size of the gift, but what the gift actually costs the one who gives it.
- **First Fruits Giving**, NOT "What's Left Over Giving"! First Fruits Giving is an acknowledgement...a putting into practice Principle#1...that everything we have comes from God and belongs to God, and therefore, God is entitled to more than just leftovers...God is entitled to the first and the best of what we have to give!

During the second week in December, you will be receiving a stewardship packet from LCC. Please read through it carefully and take time to prayerfully focus on all God's gifts to you as you consider your commitment to returning God's gifts with increase through the generous sharing of your time, talents and treasure.

Please return the Commitment Card and Time and Talent sheets to the church within a week of receiving the letter. We know you are busy, and don't want these to be forgotten!

In the coming weeks, we hope to see you as we celebrate Advent and the coming of Christ. Your council is busy putting together a budget to keep the church operational, planning to call a new Director of Discipleship (re-named Pastoral Assistant position), making commitments to the building, to mission support and our many ministries in 2018. None of this can happen without you! WE are the church, together!

Updating Our Congregation's Constitution:

In August 2016, the ELCA Churchwide Assembly voted to update the Model Constitution for Congregations. The draft, competently prepared for LCC by Synod Attorney Murray Sagsveen, is available for by contacting Connie in the church office. Because it is lengthy, and to save on paper and postage, printed copies will only be available if you ask for one, otherwise it will be sent to you electronically upon your request.

This new constitution (see a summary article elsewhere by Murray) must be ratified by a congregational written ballot vote at our annual meeting. It will be an agenda item for that meeting on Jan 14^{th} .

Constitutional Changes Summary

Last year, the ELCA Churchwide Assembly updated the Model Constitution for Congregations. The proposed amendments, to be considered by this congregation at the annual meeting on January 14, would bring the LCC constitution into compliance with the ELCA Model Constitution for Congregations.

Most of the provisions in the constitution are required (indicated by an asterisk [*]), so can't be changed by a congregation, except for the options in brackets. Two examples:

- Section *C8.02.d. allows an associate member to hold a membership in another [ELCA] [Lutheran] or [Christion] congregation.
- Section *9.01 states whether [this congregation] or [the Congregation Council] elects the call committee when calling a minister of Word and Sacrament.

Other provisions, not indicated by an asterisk, can be tailored to fit an individual congregation's culture. Three examples:

- Chapter 10 allows the congregation to establish the guidelines for its annual congregation meeting.
- Chapters 11 and 12 allow the congregation to determine the elections and terms of its council members and officers.
- Chapter 13 allows the congregation to determine the number and organizational structure of its committees.

Two important sections, C12.04. and C12.05., provide the "position description" for the Congregation Council. The congregation elects the council members, who constitute the board of directors for the church corporation, to provide leadership for the "general oversight of the life and activities of this congregation, and in particular its worship life" and for the "financial and property matters of this congregation."

The congregation can also adopt bylaws to implement constitution provisions. Examples are C13.02.01., C13.02.02., C13.02.03., and C13.02.04., which address the Nominating Committee.

Members of the congregation may view the proposed constitution and bylaws by contacting the Church office and asking that a copy be emailed to them or by stopping by the office and asking Connie to print out a copy.
