The Merriam Webster dictionary defines Lament as a way to, "express sadness or regret" and Laughter as "a cause of merriment."

On January 26th - 28th Camp of the Cross Ministries is hosting a men's weekend retreat that will bring together the prayers of lament and the merriment of laughter to participants as they laugh and sing themselves into God's presence.

Through lectures and Bible study participants will follow Jesus on his journey from the betrayal following his final meal with his disciples to the lament of Good Friday and the triumph of Easter morning.

The weekend <u>begins at 5:30 PM Friday</u> as participants gather at Ye Olde Malt Shop in Garrison ND for an evening meal before heading to Camp of the Cross. The retreat concludes with <u>Sunday morning</u> worship followed by brunch, before leaving by noon. <u>Saturday afternoon 1:00 PM - 5:00 PM</u> is designated free time. There will be a work project at the camp or simply time to relax.

Steven is a rostered ELCA Deacon (Minister of Word and Service) from Darien, Il (Chicago area). He graduated from seminary about a year ago and has significant experience with youth leadership, multi-generational ministry and currently is employed as a Chaplin at a Hospice facility providing support services to terminally ill patients and their families. His wife is a paraprofessional with the local school system but has worked as a pharmacy tech and as a case manager at facilities providing services to people with disabilities (which is what she describes as her "perfect fit" employment), like HIT.

Steven has a BA from St. Olaf College in Northfield, MN, a Masters in Education from the University of Illinois and a Master of Divinity from Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago. He describes his areas of expertise as Preaching/Worship Leadership, Youth Leadership/Teaching, Spiritual Formation/Direction and Pastoral Care/Visitation with specific strengths in Small Group Ministry, Youth and Family Ministry, Ministry in Daily Life, Outreach Ministry and Ministry with Seniors. He has about six years of teaching experience, having taught in schools in Alaska, China and South America.

Both Steven and Kristina are excellent communicators (both written and oral) and Kristina has experience in social media communications.

Steven, in his own words describes himself this way: "I am called to the ministry of Word & Service as a teacher, chaplain, and one who serves a congregation. I have many gifts and talents for ministry that include listening, praying, preaching, and providing the ministry of presence. I want to help others during difficult times in their lives and equip others to live as disciples of Christ."

Updating Our Congregation's Constitution:

In August 2016, the ELCA Churchwide Assembly voted to update the Model Constitution for Congregations. The draft, competently prepared for LCC by Synod Attorney Murray Sagsveen, is available for by contacting Connie in the church office. Because it is lengthy, and to save on paper and postage, printed copies will only be available if you ask for one, otherwise it will be sent to you electronically upon your request.

This new constitution (see a summary article elsewhere by Murray) must be ratified by a congregational written ballot vote at our annual meeting. It will be an agenda item for that meeting on Jan 14^{th} .

Constitutional Changes Summary

Last year, the ELCA Churchwide Assembly updated the Model Constitution for Congregations. The proposed amendments, to be considered by this congregation at the annual meeting on January 14, would bring the LCC constitution into compliance with the ELCA Model Constitution for Congregations.

Most of the provisions in the constitution are required (indicated by an asterisk [*]), so can't be changed by a congregation, except for the options in brackets. Two examples:

Section *C8.02.d. allows an associate member to hold a membership in another [ELCA] [Lutheran] or [Christion] congregation.

Section *9.01 states whether [this congregation] or [the Congregation Council] elects the call committee when calling a minister of Word and Sacrament.

Other provisions, not indicated by an asterisk, can be tailored to fit an individual congregation's culture. Three examples:

Chapter 10 allows the congregation to establish the guidelines for its annual congregation meeting.

Chapters 11 and 12 allow the congregation to determine the elections and terms of its council members and officers.

Chapter 13 allows the congregation to determine the number and organizational structure of its committees.

Two important sections, C12.04. and C12.05., provide the "position description" for the Congregation Council. The congregation elects the council members, who constitute the board of directors for the church corporation, to provide leadership for the "general oversight of the life and activities of this congregation, and in particular its worship life" and for the "financial and property matters of this congregation."

The congregation can also adopt bylaws to implement constitution provisions. Examples are C13.02.01., C13.02.02., C13.02.03., and C13.02.04., which address the Nominating Committee.

Members of the congregation may view the proposed constitution and bylaws by contacting the Church office and asking that a copy be emailed to them or by stopping by the office and asking Connie to print out a copy. LUTHERAN CHURCH OF THE CROSS COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES TUESDAY, December 12, 2017

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by President Ken Will. Council members present were: Jon Hanson, Kylie Blanchard, Jeff Thomas and Tom Harris, arriving later in the meeting. Kim Humann and Brian Johnson were absent. Staff members present were: Pastor Lisa Alness, Connie Werner, and Art Wheeler.

There were no additions to the agenda.

Pastor Lisa led us in devotions.

Motion was made to approve the November minutes was made by Jon Hanson and second by Kylie Blanchard, motion carried. Art Wheeler gave the treasurer report, all bills received by November 30, 2017, have been paid. November bank statements have reconciled and registries are correct. Art stated as 2017 draws to a close, he anticipates additional expenses of \$20,000 to possibly \$23,000 in the operating fund. For contributions to equal expenses this calendar year, we'll need approximately \$50,000 in revenue yet this year. Motion was made by Jeff Thomas and second by Jon Hanson to approve the report;. Motion carried.

Pastors report: Joint thanksgiving service with Faith Lutheran, St. George Episcopal and United Church of Christ was well attended. Heart River hosted "The Longest Night/Blue Christmas service on Tuesday, December 19th and LCC was invited. The cookie walk on December 10th was a great success with many cookies sold. The people who went Christmas caroling also took cookies to the various people they visited in the Bismarck area. Everyone is busy getting ready for the Christmas and Advent season and the birth of our Savior.

There were two funerals at LCC: Lois Erickstad and Phyllis Johnson.

Director of Discipleship: There were two nice pledges made to help offset the student loans for Steven Dickens if he accepts the call to come to LCC.

Ken went to Chicago the 5th of December and visited with Steven and Kristina, they had a wonderful conversation. Steven and Kristina are in the process of adopting a child. Art will revisit Portico Insurance as it will make a difference in the cost of the family Portico premium.

Building and Grounds: The new sign is up and shining in front of the church. The interior signage will be installed the week of December 10th. The sign for the corner of the lot was tabled once again.

Mission Endowment: No report.

Worship and Music: Heart River Child Concert will be held Wednesday, December 20th.

Angels Among Us


