This is a question I want to remember to ask myself several times a day this summer, and I hope you will train yourself to make a habit of it, too.

Recently I attended a concert of the Central Dakota Children's Choirs. It included 2 of my grandchildren, a handful of LCC young people, my son and several friends among the six choirs, so I enjoyed it immensely. These concerts always end with a song with the massed choirs all singing together. It is always a highlight, as those hundreds of voices rise with power and majesty and angels soaring above. (Not that I'm dramatic at all.) But this one had tears streaming down my face.

Why? It began with the younger choirs, grades 3-6, singing the medieval plainsong hymn "Of the Father's Love Begotten," a lovely melody. Then, superimposed on that were drums to an African beat and the counterpoint of a song in Swahili (I think). It was called "Hope for Resolution." One of the choir kids told me it was written for Nelson Mandela and the end of apartheid in South Africa. All I know is, as the drums beat and those voices soared, despite the awfulness that pummels me from the newspapers and the radio and the TV and often my phone, day in and day out – despite all of the awfulness in the world, the kind that makes you just want to give up – even as tears streamed down my face... I felt hope.

And hope is a God thing.

Where do you see God at work around you? Let's talk about it. Meanwhile, see you in church – Sundays at 10 a.m. or Wednesdays at 6 p.m.!

LCC Now Has New (Electronic!) Ways to Give to God!

Check out these new, easy ways to give electronically, right from your smartphone! Not to worry, it's easy! As long as you use the same email address for all, these gifts also sync completely with our current online giving option from our website, so your giving history is complete and can be accessed from either.

Now you can make a contribution by text!

Get Started: Enter LCC's Give+ text number – 701-969-7030 -- and text the amount you wish to donate to that number. For example, text 25 to the number above for a \$25 donation.

Register: You will receive a registration link (the first time only). Click the link and enter your contact and payment information. Note: this will not be a charge that goes on your phone bill, like you might be familiar with if you remember giving to the earthquake in Haiti, say, a few years ago. For this text giving, you enter a credit or debit card number, and that is what the donation is charged to.

Give: After registration is complete, you'll receive a verification text as well as a receipt via email.

Repeat: If you want to make the gift a recurring one, text the word repeat and it will process automatically annually, quarterly, monthly or weekly, as you choose.

Or, give through the Give + Mobile App

IPhone and Android users can now make a contribution through a mobile app!

You can download the app for free from the App Store. Simply search for "give plus church" to quickly find and start using the app. It's easy to make a one-time or recurring donations to multiple funds with your credit or debit card.

You can also choose whether to donate as a guest or set up an account (again, registration is a one-time event) that allows you to securely and conveniently manage, schedule and review donations using Touch ID, PIN or password.

To use, enter the church's name: Lutheran Church of the Cross. Click Donate Now. Choose the fund to which you'd like to give and a preset amount, or enter another amount. (Click *Make Another Donation* to make additional gifts in the same transaction). Click *Next* to scan or enter your credit card information. Review your donation summary and select *Complete Donation*. And that's it! Tithing and Texting are easy!

BABY CARE KITS

SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

- · Please include sizes between 6 and 24 months. Varying the sizes of the clothing items included will make the Baby Care Kit useful as the baby grows.
- · Sweaters may be knitted or crocheted from leftover yarn, or made from heavy double knits or fleece. Select a pattern that suits your skill level. Preferred styles have buttons or ties down the front.
- · Diapers can be made from flannel or even by recycling t-shirts. Download a Diaper Tip Sheet from our website.
- · If knitting or crocheting receiving blankets, including one knitted/crocheted blanket and one flannel blanket will provide maximum versatility.
- · Onesies can be cut and hemmed or serged to make a simple t-shirt.
- · Gowns, rompers or top/pants sets can be substituted for sleepers.
- · Gently used, clean clothing and blankets (no stains or tears) may be substituted for new ones. It is especially important that the items be in excellent condition, as used clothing is increasingly difficult to get through customs in many countries. Even one item that looks worn or stained to local officials can jeopardize the status of a whole shipment. All other items (diapers, towel, soap) in the Kit must be new.
- · Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- · Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH BABY CARE KIT

- TWO lightweight cotton t-shirts (no Onesies ®)
- TWO long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- **TWO** receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, between 36" and 52" square
- **FOUR** cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- ONE jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- TWO pairs of socks
- ONE hand towel, dark color recommended
- TWO or three bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars
- TWO diaper pins or large safety pins

HOW TO PACK YOUR PROJECT PROMISE KITS

- · Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with diaper pins.
- Pack completed Kits, like items together, in boxes. Label contents in LARGE, BLOCK LETTERS on the outside of the boxes.
- · Use strong cartons secured with packing tape, not to exceed 40 pounds.
- Do not use plastic or paper bags to pack donations.
- · Include the name and address of your group or congregation on each box and label the contents

What is Kogudus?

Kogudus is a retreat ministry in the spirit of the Reformation, gathering people together in Christ. Since its beginning in 1969 over 35,000 people in the U.S. and in other countries have attended a Kogudus retreat. Kogudus is an Estonian word for "gathering" or "Christian fellowship".

How does Kogudus work?

A team of 12-15 men and women who have attended a Kogudus, lead the retreat. Team members present lectures, and facilitate small group Bible study, discussion, and drawing of posters. Through group interaction the gospel is proclaimed and relationships are formed. In

addition there is plenty of hymn singing, prayer time and worship opportunities.

Where are the retreats held?

The purpose of Kogudus is to provide renewal and affirmation of our faith in Christ. Through a series of one day seminars and weekend retreats, Kogudus programs offer participants an opportunity to be renewed in their faith and commitment to Christ and to become affirmed in their ministry. Venues for these retreat seminars have included retreat centers, hotels, churches, Bible camps, college campuses, houses, prisons and even a cow pasture! Pastors and laity serve together on teams – not only to conduct each event – but to develop partnership in the Gospel and leadership.

Is Kogudus endorsed by the ELCA?

Yes. It falls under the responsibility of the **Division for Ministry and Division for Congregational Life of the ELCA** which provides guidance and support. The Montana Synod of the ELCA is the primary sponsor of the Kogudus ministry.

Why haven't I heard of Kogudus before?

It is one of the best kept secrets in the church. Montana, North Dakota and Illinois all have active Kogudus ministries. Kogudus teams in ND have been leading retreats in prison for over 30 years.



Retreats are offered twice per year at each of the 3 ND prisons: North Dakota State Penitentiary-Bismarck; James River Correctional Center-Jamestown; Dakota Women's Correctional Rehabilitation Center-New England. Team members come from ND, MN and MT. Teams get together and spend the weekend Fri 12pm –8pm; Sat 8am - 8pm (approximately 20 hours) with a group of inmates that have signed up to participate.

If you want to know more about Kogudus in ND, speak to Pastor Gary Heaton. He has been spiritual director on Kogudus retreats in the state prisons for 20 years and has also written a new curriculum that was recently introduced for the retreats.

If I make a donation where will my money go?

Your donation will go to the Kogudus general fund to help cover expenses. The director receives a small stipend, there are some office expenses, the cost of publishing and mailing a quarterly

newsletter, and supplies for the retreats. The majority of their funding comes from congregations and individual donations. Team members pay all of their own expenses when leading retreats including mileage, motel and meals.

What else do I need to know?

Kogudus is registered as a non-profit organization in the state of Montana and is governed by a board of directors. The main office is in Great Falls MT. Rev.
