

From Pastor Lisa,

It is the Lord who goes before you. He will be with you; he will not fail you or forsake you. Do not fear or be dismayed. Deuteronomy 31:8

How are you doing? That is a question we are asking each other during these weeks-stretching-into-months of living in a world changed by COVID-19. I find myself forming new habits and ways of dealing with the gamut of emotions that come with long term anxiety and uncertainty of what lies ahead.

Have you noticed, time itself has changed? That's perception, of course, but early on, each day seemed about a week long, as everything had to happen in new ways. We're not seeing other people in the usual patterns and ways, and so the hours ebb and flow differently.

Despite the stack of really great books on my bedside table and to-read list, I find myself reading one I've read before, in the same way that I would never tire of watching a certain movie or two, for the simple comfort they bring. And, oddly, I collected several books on pandemics - for instance, about the flu epidemic in 1918 - and including one called "Journal of a Plague Year" by Daniel Dafoe, who wrote Robinson Crusoe. That particular plague year was 1665-66, when the bubonic plague hit London very hard.

Isaac Newton was in his early 20s and a student at Cambridge when that wave of the plague hit. Even though the bacteria that caused it weren't discovered until a couple of centuries afterward, folks in those times also took measures to mitigate the crisis, including their ways of social distancing. All the colleges closed, and students were sent home, young Isaac to his estate 60 miles to the north just as my son, in his early 20s and studying in London, was sent home this year (like so many others) as the illness spread.

Newton called his time away "the year of wonders" as he continued to learn. He developed early calculus. He learned theories of optics from playing with prisms. And that big apple tree outside his window helped him imagine gravity that doesn't just make an apple fall to the ground, but is a force at work far beyond our small selves. I read an article that said this unstructured time apart (who knows? maybe

half the time in pajamas!) was life changing for him.

How has it been life changing for you?

We may not be Isaac Newton, but we are each of us unique, and what opportunities there are amidst the changes!

What observations have you made? What are you learning? What do you notice in nature, as you take more time to walk about? What do you hear? How have you stewarded your spiritual life– praying? Time spent nurturing it? Joining in worship via livestream, radio or TV? What are you reading? Creating? What brings you joy? What acts of compassion are you motivated to do: write a note or call someone, make masks for use where needed, run a small errand, fill a little food pantry with provisions?

It may have been years since I heard the birds sing as I do this year. Or watched quite as breathlessly as the crabapples blossom and the lilacs bud and the tulips poke their colorful heads out.

I miss you. I am grateful for you. The council and your leaders are working on a restart plan for when we can be back in worship, as safely as possible. We will keep you updated! Til then, I'll "see" you in worship. Be well. Take care, and take heart- we are safe in God's hands.

To enhance the new care center, the MSLCC Board of Directors decided to sponsor a Capital Campaign to raise the funds for a chapel, hydrotherapy pool, employee childcare center, fitness center, clubroom/library, and a Bistro/Coffee Shop as a place for residents and families to come together.

In the future, there will be mailings and temple talks, but the question for the council is to allow the sharing of our contact list with MSLCC for these mass mailings.

Treasurer's Report – Jon H motion/Mark second/APPROVED

All bills and statements as of March 31st have been paid.

All March bank statements have been reconciled and registries are correct.

- Total adjusted income for March was \$40,904.72. Income was \$4,095 more than the budget goal of \$36,810. The main reason for this was the receipt of \$15,000 in charitable gifts. Many thanks for this additional financial help.
- The adjusted March expenses were \$28,383.18. The net income for the month was \$12,521.54. The lesser expenses than budgeted were wonderful. Expenses for several budget categories were less than budget which helped the net income.
- The adjusted income excluded designated income not part of the General Operating Fund. I have also included in the report, a full Budget vs Actual review for March, expenses were all in a normal range.
- The contribution to the Western North Dakota Synod for March will be \$1,922. We will have contributed \$4,543 towards the annual goal of \$25,000.
- The special assessment pay-off as ratified by the congregation will be addressed and paid as budget allows.
