From Pastor Lisa

My cousin Naomi died yesterday.

I could go on at length about all the connections between us and how precious and important she was to me. I realize, of course, that I am not unique in this loss of one beloved to me. And I don't wish to talk about loss or grief today, but rather the latest gift she gave me.

Naomi was a wonder, not only because she beat an advanced colon and liver cancer over 20 years ago. She was an energizer bunny person with a sly grin and good humor and vivid white hair in a bob, which meant you could locate her in any crowd. She was a planner and organizer and family historian; as Norwegian as they come. And most of all, a person of deep faith.

Naomi's husband Don is a Lutheran pastor, retired now. He led a Bible study some years ago and encouraged participants to start a notebook that was their "Treasure Book." The hand-out from the Bible study says: "Following is a list of Treasures I have stored in my notebook. Include in YOUR notebook ones that are helpful to you and add others that you treasure. Don Rice" Then he proceeded to list his favorite scriptures.

Naomi took this to heart and started her own Book of Treasures in October 2005. In it she collected her favorite scriptures, hymns, poems, quotes, snippets from the ELCA's Gather magazine and others.

Recently she went from "feeling a little off" to realizing later with testing that the cancer had returned with a vengeance. And in just a month, she was gone.

Her children and grandchildren shared these Treasures as devotions each night and talked about them with her. Some of her treasures include Psalm 46, "God is our refuge and strength: a very present help in trouble"; the hymn "Have No Fear Little Flock"; their children's bedside prayer, "Jesus, Tender Shepherd, hear me. Bless thy little lamb tonight"; Psalm 103:1-5 "Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me." Matthew 11: 28-30, "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest."

I am grateful that Naomi stored up these treasures that have been her guideposts in life, and shared their wisdom and guidance with her family. What a gift! Thanks be to God.

What would you put in your Treasure Book? I think I'm going to start one. I hope you do, too. Peace to you today.

Hope you are all enjoying the crisp fall air and the colorful foliage that remains, mostly on the ground after the wind cleared the trees!




