

#### Kraft's Family Stroganoff Jason Kraft

1 1/2 # round steak, cut into strips	1/4 lb. butter
2 lbs. onions, sliced	1 tsp. soy sauce
1 can tomato soup	1 tsp. salt
1 can mushrooms	1/8 tsp. pepper
1 (6 oz.) can tomato paste	1 c. sour cream

Brown steak and onions in butter. Simmer all ingredients, except sour cream, in large stock-pot for 1 hour. Add sour cream and stir gently. Service over hot rice or noodles. Yield: 6—8 servings.


