

1/2 c. butter
1/2 c. brown sugar
1/4 tsp. salt
1 c. flour
1 tc. brown sugar
1 c. coconut
1 c. brown sugar
2 beaten eggs

Mix first three ingredients. Pat into a 9 x 13 inch pan. Bake at 350° for 10 minutes. Mix remaining 6 ingredients; spread over first mixture. Bake at 350° For 25 minutes. Cool; cut into bars. Yield 24 to 30 bars.


