

Hello to all parents!

We're writing today to the parents of all church school or confirmation aged young people at Church of the Cross. With the departure of Deacon Janie on her call to the wilds of Like Sakakawea and Camp of the Cross, the church council is actively working the process to call a new Deacon or Pastor to Church of the Cross, In the meantime, the LCC Education Committee has taken on the role of organizing and planning for the 2023-2024 church school and confirmation year.

First, we want to assure you that we are drafting a curriculum for the fall semester including a full schedule and will be publishing materials and schedules for parents and students closer to the start of the fall semester. For Confirmands, we'll be kicking off confirmation classes on September 6th with orientation.

For church school—aged kids, we're hard at work on organizing something for Rally Days. We hope you and your kids can be there. One key change that you'll be hearing more about soon is how LCC will provide church school opportunities on Sundays (during a portion of the church service.) Instead of traditional, before service church school, LCC will be inviting pre-k through 4th grade age groups attending church on Sunday with families to a kid-focused session where we'll briefly but large engagingly spending time getting to know more about the Bible and Jesus (Jesus and Me!) with a story based on the gospel for that day. After spending time together, the kids will be returned to their parents and the traditional end to the worship service.

Wednesday church school classes will continue to utilize a more traditional approach to church school, hosting kids in an after church session focused on the same lessons. Everyone is encouraged to check out both groups to find which time and style works for you and your family. Later this month you can expect more information to be sent to your homes and also published online though the church website at https://churchofthecross.org/school-youth-confirmation/. That's all for now. Thanks for your time and looking forward to seeing everyone at church school and confirmation.

Yours in Christ, LCC Education Committee **GriefShare Ministry** will be offered at Charity Lutheran again this fall, with Lorri Mittleider as lead facilitator. The 13 week GriefShare sessions will begin on Thursday, September 7, from 6:30-8:00 p.m. and run up through November 30 at Charity Lutheran Church, 120 Aspen Ave, Bismarck. This faith-based program emphasizes confidentiality and is designed to help come alongside those who have experienced significant loss of spouse, parent, child, close family member or friend. Each evening consists of opening prayer, watching a 1/2 hour video and following along with a purchased workbook. We then meet together in small groups where we get to know one another and have the opportunity to share thoughts about the video topic and presentation. Small group leaders are compassionate and caring and have worked through a significant loss themselves with the help of attending the GriefShare program. GriefShare is designed to help others come to a place where they can move from the state of mourning to experiencing real joy again in this new season of life. The fee is \$25 to help cover cost of the workbook. Zucchini Muffins

2 c. sugar
3 lg eggs
1 c oil
3 c. flour
1 c. oatmeal
2 tsp. baking powder

1 tsp. baking soda

1 tsp. salt 1 tsp. nutmeg 2 c. raisins

2 c. chopped nuts4 c. grated zucchini

Beat sugar, eggs, and oil. Add dry ingredients. Fold in raisin, nuts, and zucchini. Fill muffin cups 1/2 full. Bake at 350 for 20 minutes. Yield 4 dozen muffins.

Note: This makes a large amount, but they freeze well and it's nice to have them on hand for drop-in company coffee.


