Call Process Update

No doubt you are wondering where we are in the process of calling a new rostered minister (this term refers to all ordained ministers, pastors and deacons) to fill the position in which Deacon Janie served. The call committee was formed by the council in the late spring, after a meeting with Pr. Brad Dokken, Assistant to the Bishop for Candidacy and Call. After getting up to speed on what was needed, the call committee finished the Ministry Site Profile (which describes LCC, the community and the position), which was then submitted to the ELCA database where it can be seen by any rostered minister searching for a call. The synod assists in matching ministers to open positions in their area.

The call committee had an initial zoom meeting with a candidate in late August. (This step is currently always done via zoom, even if a candidate should live close enough to come in person, to level the playing field for those from further away.) The committee felt it was a positive meeting and chose to invite the candidate for an inperson interview. This happened in late September.

From there, if the call committee's consensus is that this is a great candidate, they would submit the name to the council. Council then votes on the candidate, and if positive, the executive committee moves into work on the compensation offer to the candidate and schedules a congregational meeting to vote on the call.

Meanwhile, we have not received any other candidates. The one we interviewed is also interviewing in other places. As someone in the synod told me, "it's a minister's market right now." We have 30+ openings in the Western North Dakota Synod alone, and other synods have many openings, too. So there are many congregations seeking pastors.

The LCC call committee was very excited about the candidate we interviewed, and would love to submit that name to the council. However, for now, the candidate has asked us to wait, for a period of discernment.

We trust that the Holy Spirit is at work in this process! And, while we selfishly hope the Spirit has chosen this candidate for us, we will just need to wait a bit longer and see. Please continue to pray for guidance for all involved. We know God has plans for our future!

The Blessing of the Animals - 7 pm Wednesday, October 4

The Day of St. Francis of Assisi, patron saint of the animals, is October 4th. Statues of the gentle friend of animals are often seen in corners of gardens or under a rose bush. A special tradition has been recovered from the pages of history, and is occurring in more and more churches across the country.

The Blessing of the Animals was extremely important in medieval Europe, where the loss of the herd could mean starvation for the village. So, the cows and horses, sheep and geese, along with dogs and cats (though probably not llamas or iguanas) were brought to the village church, so the priest could ask God's blessing on them and their caretakers.

Over the years, this ritual became associated with St. Francis, and was tied to the feast day which commemorates him. Then came the Reformation, and the settling of the New World by many Protestants who wanted freedom to worship "their way." And some of the beautiful traditions of the Euro-catholic church were lost along the way.

In our modern world, we are re-discovering the beauty and joy of having a special day to bring our animals to God, to ask for God's blessing for them and for our relationships, and to commemorate St. Francis of Assisi. I'm quite sure the gentle man would be surprised to see the clothes and collars some of our fur-children wear, but he would recognize the love we give and receive from our pets. So, bring your pet to church! J Pastor Lisa (and the confirmation students, assisting) will be on the front lawn after worship on Wednesday, October 4th, welcoming all who want to bring their beloved animals – cows, horses, dogs, cats, even the llamas and iguanas. Just be sure they are leashed, kenneled or controlled appropriately, so that all God's creatures can be safe. Each animal will receive a blessing, and each owner a certificate to remember it by.

Your LCC Mission Endowment Fund

The LCC Mission Endowment Fund was established as a permanent endowment fund, the purpose of which is to enhance the outreach and mission of LCC and to assist in specific capital or special expenses. Endowment funds are partnerships between donors and the church. Partnerships based on the idea of mutual stewardship. Endowment funds provide additional support for ministries and special projects beyond the yearly operating budget, as well as supporting the future generations of LCC. Each year, the Endowment Committee will transfer a portion of the Endowment Fund's annual earnings, as dictated by its By Laws, to identified ministries for their use.

Gifts, to the Endowment Fund, made through your contributions, wills, and estate planning process extend financial support to the Endowment Fund. If possible, please consider discussing your gifts, confidentially, with a committee member in advance so we may work with you and ensure your intentions are honored.

Your financial gifts to the Endowment Fund are placed in a professionally managed portfolio (the ELCA Ministry Growth Fund). There is no minimum amount for a gift. All gifts from members and friends of LCC support and benefit the ministry and mission of LCC. LCC and its Endowment Fund are a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization.

One of the "painless" ways to contribute is via an IRA Charitable Rollover. If you are 72 ½ or older, you can use the IRA charitable rollover to help the LCC Mission Endowment Fund continue its important work. The IRA charitable rollover allows you to meet your required minimum distribution (RMD) by directing your distribution to the Fund rather than taking it yourself.

North Dakota allows a Tax Credit for individuals, businesses, trusts, and estates wherein they can take advantage of a 40% state tax credit for contributions of over \$5,000 to a true endowment like LCC's Mission Endowment Fund.

We invite you to explore the charitable giving opportunities available to you. Gifts, both cash and property, may be made as outright gifts or bequests, or by naming LCC as a beneficiary of a 401(k) or IRA, a life insurance policy, or a charitable trust.

Sound System Update

An upgrade to our sound system in the sanctuary has been in the works for a few years. The last few months, a dedicated team of folks has come together to implement the needed changes. Dallas Anderson, an expert with Tricorne Audio, was our advisor. He worked with a team of LCC experts in worship, production and installation: Beth Greff, Lavern Hanson, Kerry Carpenter, Tom Harris, Paul Gurholt and John Kraft. Significant gifts were given specifically for this project, which enabled the team to go ahead rather than wait for budget monies to be designated or a fundraising process to happen. We are grateful to the donors who made this sound enhancement possible!

As of this week, you will notice a livelier, clearer sound in worship. You may have noticed last week that acoustic panels have been installed on walls on three sides of the sanctuary. This is to help manage how the sound bounces around the shape of the room. Now, this week, the new digital soundboard has also been installed. In addition to being simpler for the sound techs to run, this soundboard upgrades the quality of sound in house and on the livestream. There still are some outlying things that will need to be done: stands for the new monitors; speaker upgrades. If you'd like to give toward those or sponsor a part of them, speak to Beth Greff.
