#### From Pastor Lisa

The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. John 1:5

December. This is the season of darkness in our area. Many go to work or school while it is still dark, and come home when it is dark again. Darkness feels so pervasive, that, when coupled with the cold of winter, it can feel heavy and oppressive.

This feeling is deepened when we consider the state of the world around us. Feeding ministries serving hundreds of people per day. Folks seeking shelter from the cold fill the places that offer it before winter has even turned terrible. War, ongoing war, war in even the holiest of places brings with it many forms of suffering and devastation. So much violence, so much need – we feel inadequate to help enough and overwhelmed by it all.

My husband and I are "older and wiser" enough nowadays that we have given up climbing on the roof to hang lights on the eaves this season. We put red and green bulbs in our outside lantern lights and call it good! However, in this season of darkness, I do really appreciate the lights on houses – whether they go all out, or are lovely and artistic, or are just a string on the porch. Even the small ones, even our few light bulbs, help dispel the darkness, help us see the way.

Noticing that, last night, made me think about the other kinds of darkness in our world. We can't do it all. We do feel overwhelmed. We don't want people to suffer.

In the gospel last week from Matthew 25, Jesus tells surprised followers that whenever they took care of someone in need, they did the same for him. And the same was true whenever they **didn't** take care of someone in need.

I want to say thank you for all the ways you care for others. Even when you're busy; even when you're overwhelmed. Your generosity with your talents, and your time, and your finances – inside and outside of church - is an inspiration to others and fulfilling your call in baptism to serve God's people.

O God our light, may our lives reflect you. May we live peace. Amen. Blessings to you this Advent and Christmas! Pastor Lisa

Carrie Kids; Altar Focus for December Carrie Kids will be the Altar Focus for the month of December. A Christmas tree is set up in the narthex with jean ornaments listing the sizes of K –6th grade boys. Jeans are the primary focus with other items such as socks and underwear are needed. Carrie Kids is a local organization working with 150-200 children and adolescents weekly who are homeless or at risk with a variety of programs, events, groups to reach them. Our second Altar Focus for December is Good Gifts, which is a program of our denomination, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. We have catalogs available on the table by the fountain in the narthex, and ornaments on the small tree and a table in the narthex as well. You can choose something, make the appropriate donation to LCC and memo it "Good Gifts" (there are cute cards on the table for you to send the recipient as well), or you can do everything online at www.elca.org/ goodgifts. These gifts are great teaching tools for kids (who are excited to know how the honeybees, or goat, or chicks they have given will help a family across the world live better), and perfect for the person who has everything! There is something to suit everyone's interests, from animals, to tuition, to counseling, to vaccinations, to plants and trees, and much much more. Here's a way to add meaning to your Christmas, and to someone else's as well.
