

From Pastor Lisa

Not that the weather isn't always a topic of conversation in North Dakota – but we've

had quite an interesting winter (or lack of it) and spring (or lack of it)! I joked with a few people that the last few weeks of up and down temperatures were designed specifically so that we all would get sick in the end! But hopefully many of us escaped the colds and flu.

I write this in Holy Week, as we journey together from the hallelujahs and waving palms of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, through the story of his passion and crucifixion, and out the other side to the joy and amazement of his resurrection.

The services this week are varied and interesting. If you've not experienced all of them, they will deepen your faith – come and see! Maundy Thursday at 7 pm we celebrate the Last Supper with Jesus and his disciples and watch as he cares for them like a servant, washing their feet. Good Friday we strip the altar bare as we experience a Tenebrae service of readings and shadows. Holy Saturday we join with five other churches to do a one-hour Easter Vigil at 7 pm at Lord of Life Lutheran Church (1143 N. 26th Street) – this is a very interesting service of fire, word, water, and communion – no sermon. And on Easter morning we have two services, at 8 am and 10 am, with a continental breakfast in between. Except for the 8 am Easter service, they are all livestreamed, so if you miss one, you can look it up and watch it from our website.

Once again, this year our church school children – and some confirmation students as well! – got creative with Bible stories and marshmallow "peeps", fashioning dioramas of Bible stories with the colorful peeps starring as the characters. These dioramas are currently in the fellowship hall, serving as centerpieces on the tables. If you haven't seen them yet, come admire and appreciate their artistic creativity this weekend! (the thing about peep dioramas is that they're not terribly long-lasting!)

As they do this project, naturally the students talk about their favorite Bible stories. Have you ever done that with someone? It's a great way to break the ice and maybe even gain insight into the story, through their perspective. What's your favorite Bible story or character, and why? This might be a very fun thing to share with one another around your Easter table. God's story is always intimately connected with our own! Blessings as we celebrate the joy of Easter, and of spring coming again. See you in church!

Speaking of Generosity – Opportunities for Giving

At worship you often hear me thank you for your generosity. We are grateful! Our many ministries here at LCC and those we support in the community and wider world could not do it without you! Here are some ways you can give at and through LCC. Choose which fits your lifestyle best!

Offering envelopes: These are found on the oak cabinet in the narthex, far right side (or ask treasurer Art Wheeler, if they are gone). You can put cash or checks in these and as long as your name is on it (or Art is aware of your envelope number), your offering will be recorded for you.

Online: we use Vanco for our other forms of giving. All the options are linked, so you can give through any of the following ways, and they will all be recorded for you. Art sends statements a couple of times per year.

Website: you can easily set up an online giving account on our website – then you don't have to do it each time you go online. You can also set recurring gifts if you like, and choose various funds to give to, through the website.

Vanco Mobile App: you can download the Vanco Mobile app on your phone. This will link to the same account, if you've set one up on the website, or you can give only through the app if you like. Just make sure to choose OUR Lutheran Church of the Cross, as there are others!

Text: You can also give by text! I know – the world these days! Many people no longer carry cash – but almost everyone carries their smart phone. So, you can use the Vanco Mobile app, OR you can simply send a text to our dedicated number: **701969-7030**. Just put a number in the message – 20 if you'd like to give \$20, etc. It will prompt you to sign in or set up a Vanco account (which would have your credit, debit or checking account number, which is where the money would come from in any of these cases – all safely encrypted, of course. This is the same account used for the other methods.). You can test this by giving a \$1 donation, say, and if you find it simple – maybe this will be your choice for giving!
