The workshop is from 6-9 pm on Friday, Oct. 18th, at the UCC, with dinner provided, and on Saturday, Oct. 19th from 8 am to 2 pm, with both breakfast and lunch provided. The training is being sponsored by the Northern Plains Conference of the United Church of Christ. Participants are invited to make a free will offering to help with costs.

We will have an extra session at LCC later for those who would be willing to take communion to someone who can't get to church (for instance, someone who can't really watch online and use an all-in-one communion cup by themselves, but would really like to receive communion). 


Trunk or Treat October 27!
